should take LAS 101 the same semester. Students who need an additional credit in order to graduate should take LAS
201 in their last year; students who will achieve 60 credits without LAS are exempt from the LAS requirement.
2 - Select from ENG-201, ENG-203, ENG-204, HIS-213, HIS-215, HIS-231, HIS-232 or REL-102.
3 - Choose from the 3-credit science courses for Liberal Arts-BIO 113, CHE 106, OHT 101, and PHY 111.
4 - Take one language in a progressive sequence; start at 101 only if this is a new language for you. Consult Global Studies faculty advisor regarding the transferability of language courses. If language courses are CLEP'd, you must meet with the Global Studies faculty advisor and the World Languages Coordinator.
